Brazil: Matueté suggests Nhô Hotel at Inhotim

The combination of cutting-edge contemporary art and a beautiful landscaped park has made Inhotim a mecca for the art world, drawing a who's-who to the museum an hour from Belo Horizonte, "But the problem has always been where to stay," says Martin Frankenberg, who runs the São Paulo-based travel company Matueté. But by the end of 2014, "Inhotim is due to open a hotel on the premises that promises to be as nice as the incredible art collection." Called Nhô and designed by Freusa Zechmeister, it will comprise 44 "houses" of more than 1,200 square feet each and come with tech flourishes like an exclusive app that will let guests communicate with their butlers while strolling through the Inhotim park.
